

SWOSDA Remember When...

Looking Back - 2023 - 03 by Dorothy Dahm - SWOSDA Historian

As you probably are aware, I have spent a lot of time during the last few months looking back at square dance stuff and lots of items that I collected through my last 40 years living in this home. The reason for this was the decision by my daughter to move home to live with me throughout my advanced years. The original thought had been that we would both sell our current homes and buy a suitable spot in London but financially it works out better to move to Tillsonburg where there is no mortgage to be paid.

She has now sold her condo and has moved into the basement level of my home. There had been no bathroom on that level and no egress window in the bedroom, so there was some major reno work which also included painting and new flooring in the living area before she could settle in. Preceding that, everything from that area had to find a new home.

Square Dance related items were the first to move. Archive shelves now take up a corner of my bedroom. Display boards will be stored in my sewing/spare room. Tom Charlton finally came and relieved me of some books, records and other equipment which could probably be of use to other dancers and prospective new callers.

Some household items replaced others in what had been a household storage room in the basement while the garage soon filled with boxes that would be dealt with later. Second hand stores fell heir to unneeded furniture and one of my neighbours generously hauled away multiple loads of garbage to the transfer station . My dining area and much of my living room continually had boxes in corners and under tables that I was working on. The kitchen is a work in progress as we sort and figure out which of our tools and supplies. I'm not finished yet but it's looking up.

We cleared away the garage halfway so that Lisa's vehicle could get inside in time to make it easy for her just before the last couple of storms but mine has been sitting outside since reno started. Yesterday I took nearly an hour to chip away the snow and ice so I could get away for the afternoon. I have to get busy clearing away the other half of the garage or start hoping there are no more ice storms like that.

In the hours that I allot to the square dance archives I have been trying to organize the information that I do have and fill in the gaps where I don't. I would appreciate your help. Especially in the last ten years, the albums are pretty sparse because I don't get out to the clubs to take pictures or find out what is going on around the area. So please if you have pictures or write-ups of what has gone on, I would really really appreciate you sending a few to me.

I ran out of time to do my usual overview of the March Bugles for years ending in 3, so I apologize. I'll guess there will be lots of related Irish and green events. So I'll close with an...

SQUARE & ROUND DANCERS OF SOUTH WESTERN ONTARIO INC. Suggested Banner Stealing Guidelines

When applying the banner stealing guidelines, please remember that there are no hard and fast rules when we are out for fun. Common sense and friendliness should take precedence.

- 1. The purpose of Banner Stealing is to aid and assist clubs financially and socially, and to preserve and promote harmony between dancers and clubs.
- 2. The Club should decide if they are going to participate in Banner trading. If any Club should decide not to participate, they would need only to make their wishes known.
- 3. Contact the club ahead of time to arrange a date suitable to both clubs.
- 4. In order to steal a Banner, one or more squares shall attend the club dance for the evening. If more than one club arrives for the intended thievery, the first club to register a full square shall get the banner. Some other token of appreciation could be presented to the unsuccessful club(s). This token of appreciation would be up to the discretion of the host club.
- 5. Take only the Banner belonging to the club being visited.
- 6. In order to retrieve the Banner (or token) one or more squares shall attend your club dance.
- 7. Any dancers belonging to both clubs may participate by wearing the stealing or retrieving club's badge and paying the visitor's fee.
- 8. A banner may be stolen or retrieved only when the host club is dancing on their regular night in their usual hall with their own caller.
- 9. You cannot retrieve your Banner and steal theirs at the same dance.
- 10. Do not steal a banner from a Club that dances on the <u>same night</u> as your Club, unless arrangements can be made for its retrieval without causing dancers to abandon their own club's dance.
- 11. Stolen banners are the responsibility of the Club and should be displayed at Monthly Dances of the Square & Round Dancers of South Western Ontario Inc.
