

SWOSDA Remember When...

Looking Back at April Bugles -23/04

1973 – The first item which caught my eye was the following: "Denny and Judy Howlett would like to thank the Shiloh Buckles and Bows for being such a wonderful club. They are a bunch of schemers, plotters and thieves, but you couldn't ask for better people or a better club. Thanks for putting up with us these last few years." What wonderful memories these folk must share with the Howletts and the rest of the club!

When Nick and I were just beginner dancers at Simcoe, Denny was guest caller at the club. Although we knew that we would not be dancing that evening we went out to support the club, share the work of a special dance and see in action this great caller we had been told about. It wasn't long before Denny sought us out to find out why we weren't dancing. He shot down the idea that we didn't know enough to participate yet and told us to get up in the next tip and he would show us how to have fun. Needless to say from then on, with a little more experience under our belt we didn't hesitate if there was an opportunity to dance to Denny's calling. Club reports mentioned great opportunities for dancing, Forest City Festival in London, the "Big Four" dance in Cambridge, and Spring Fling in Sarnia to name just a few. Sixteen couples from Brantford Square-A-Naders ended off their season with a mystery bus tour which ended up at Princess Elizabeth SD Club in London for an evening of dancing.

1983 – Callers Clinic celebrated their 20th anniversary in '83 with visits from former members, Perry Stuart and Egbert Jacobs calling for dancing with figures from the past, and a display of memorabilia and scrapbooks. Lois Wise led the round dancing with some of the older dances from the past while Hilda Hibbert sang the calls to Fraulein to her partner, explaining later to the group that when she started round dancing they had to learn to do them by memory and the only way she could memorize them was to sing the cues to the music.

This issue also included a report from the Nominating Committee. They had included a possible slate of officers to be chosen at the annual meeting. The nominees had been asked to submit a short account of their dancing experience plus any other information which would help the clubs decide how to direct their delegates how to vote.

Most of the clubs were very busy with a variety of activities which provided fun, fitness, friendship and food. Banner-stealing and retrieval was very popular way that interaction between clubs was promoted. Many of the clubs also included an outline of planned summer activities including Strawberry Socials and Corn Roasts which of course had dancing as part of said activities.

1993 - "It is better to cause happiness where you go than to cause happiness when you go." This accompanied a memoriam to Perry Stuart, a London caller who had been very active in the square dance community in London and the SWOSDA district. He would be greatly missed.

In "Ken's Korner" Ken Brennan stated. "There are dancers out there that enjoy the mainstream and some that enjoy much more challenging and demanding dancing. I think that there is room in our activity for all and we should realize that each of us has a different need and attempt to satisfy as many as possible... we all need to recognize that our activity is designed to be fun, good exercise and entertaining for all of us. There will always be a variety of capabilities both on the part of the dancers and the callers. This is a good thing in that it tells me that EVERYONE IS WELCOME.!" I quite agree and noticed in this issue especially that the callers were providing lots of summer workshops to allow dances to brush up on their desired level. DD

2003 – Callers Clinic Chair Tom Charlton posted the dates for Caller's Clinic events for the season and provided notice that they had decided to have a Callers School this summer, with details to follow. A guest speaker, Mr. Lloyd Sparks from Kentucky was scheduled for the April meeting.

Simcoe Star-A-Naders advertised their first annual Trillium Dance for Camp Trillium – Rainbow Lake. The Trillium Childhood Cancer Support Centre offered and promoted recreational experiences to bring children with cancer and their families together. After the Star-A-Naders club closed in 2005, the Trillium Dance was revived by Tillsonburg's Tri-County Squares was and repeated for quite a number of years. Over the history of these benefits, over \$20,000 was raised in support of the camp.

2013 – Lots of plans for summer dancing were in the works. Strathroy started out in March with family and friends night. In order to expose more folk to our healthy and enjoyable activity another one would be held in September to be followed by a series of four ABC dances. Then a class for new dancers would then begin in October. This proved to be a successful way of bringing in new folks.

Leadership




Rhythm Rounds - London
