# **ARTICLE 5 - GENERAL MEETINGS**

I am including here, Article 5 of SWOSDA's constitution which lays out the requirements of the AGM. I mistakenly requested that clubs send two representatives rather than requesting two couples or four individual dancers. To set the record straight, I quote:

Every Member Club shall elect or appoint two couples or four persons who are not members of the Association Executive to be their representatives at all General Meetings. Every appointed member is eligible to vote at every General Meeting. Every Club Representative shall register as such at every General Meeting in order to have a vote.

# **SWOSDA Executive Positions – Explained.**

During the past few years, it seems that SWOSDA has had difficulties filling vacated executive positions. As your SWOSDA President couple, we feel it is important to address this issue now in the hopes that someone will come forward after reading and understanding what is expected of each position on the executive board. It has been brought to my attention, by an interested couple, that more people would be receptive to positions on the SWOSDA executive board if they knew the responsibilities and duties associated with each specific position.

It was also suggested that the following information regarding executive positions and their specific duties be attached to the AGM meeting agenda in the future, giving people a better understanding of expectations associated with those positions enabling them to make easier choices.

It should be understood that each and every member of the SWOSDA executive is part of a team that is willing to help each other with their respective duties.



### President

- Coordinates association activities and ensures they run in a progressive manner.
- Serves as a member ex-officio on all committees.
- Represents SWOSDA at all regular dances and other functions and prepares messages for Bugle.
- Presides at all Executive and General meetings.

# **Past President**

- Provides continuity in executive operations.
- Chairs the nominating committee.
- Performs other duties as assigned by the President.
- Reports at Executive and General meetings.

### 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President

- Assumes responsibilities and duties of the President in his/her absence.
- Performs other duties as assigned by the President.

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President

- Assumes responsibilities and duties of the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President in his/her absence.
- Performs other duties as assigned by the President.

# **Secretary** (Appointed Position)

- Serves as recording secretary at executive and general meetings, assists with agenda preparation and distributes minutes.
- Serves as the Association's general contact point (for correspondence, insurance, annual dues, etc.)
- Maintains up to date records of club memberships.
- Ensures association and corporation records are properly maintained.

# **Treasurer** (Appointed Position)

- Ensures the association's financial activities are properly recorded and maintained.
- Receives all association monies and co-signs payments for rendered services.
- Ensures an annual audit is completed shortly after financial year end.
- Reports to each Executive and General meeting.

# **Bugle Editor**

- Collects and co-ordinates items for posting to the <a href="www.swosda.ca">www.swosda.ca</a> website (Club news, flyers, other items of interest, etc.) as the Bugle is the voice of square and round dancing in southwestern Ontario.
- Compiles monthly dance calendar for all clubs.
- Publishes the Bugle monthly 9 times a year from September to June (Excluding May, July, August)
- Reports to Executive and General meetings.

# **Directors Positions**

### **Round Dance Section Leader**

- Co-ordinate round dance activities at all association dances.
- Co-ordinate round dance leaders to ensure that a round dance program is available at regular association dances and at round dance parties in May and September.
- Co-ordinates a location for the May and September association round dance parties.
- Ensures that the programs are made available to the Bugle editor for posting to the association website.
- Reports at Executive and General meetings.



# **Square Dance Section Leader**

- Co-ordinates square dance activities at all association dances.
- Co-ordinate square dance callers to ensure that a square dance program is available at regular association dances.
- Ensures that the programs are made available to the Bugle editor in a timely manner for posting to the website.
- Reports at Executive and General meetings.

### Halls and Refreshments Co-ordinator

- Arrange for member clubs to host future association dances at least one year in advance and supplies each host club with a copy of the guidelines associated with hosting association dances.
- Liaises with host clubs to ensure that club responsibilities are carried out in a timely manner in accordance with the guidelines for host clubs.
- Maintains a historical listing of club involvement.
- Reports to Executive and General meetings.

### **Registration & Door Receipts**

- Attends all association dances, arriving 30 minutes earlier for setup purposes.
- Greets dancers as they arrive and collects dance fees as they sign in.
- Collects and records attendance statistics.
- Displays a listings of member clubs at Annual General Meetings for respective delegates to sign in.
- Reports at Executive and General meetings.

### **Visitations**

- Canvasses the Executive at the beginning of the dance year to determine their choice of club(s) they would visit as SWOSDA representatives.
- Monitor the clubs visited.
- Report at Executive and General Meetings.

# **Bugle Correspondent/ Public Relations**

- Submit a written report to the Bugle editor immediately following each association dance.
- Attends Executive and General meetings.

# **SWOSDA Leadership Information Session**

In appreciation of and with the co-operation of the Canadian Callers College, Callers Clinic and SWOSDA, Jeff and Andrea Priest hosted a leadership information session on May 13, 2023, at the Maranatha Church in Woodstock.

Four specific topics were explained, discussed, and demonstrated. These topics included –

# a) What is a leader?

Dancer leadership within a club. Dancer leadership in a club without a caller Caller leadership.

The attributes and qualities of leaders were described as well as what dancers can do to be a leader within their club, not just on an executive level.

# b) What is a club "Angel"?

Discussions and direction on exactly what a dance "angel" can and cannot do in supporting the teaching process.

Another form of being an angel was described as when dancers are worked with outside the normal dance space in what is referred to as a learning station. This process is called "The Nest" and is practiced with success by a club in Alberta.

# c) What is a "Tape" group or a "Tape" club?

Specific types of tape groups were discussed. These being teaching systems groups, workshop tape groups and dance only tape groups.

Why are these tape groups necessary, what are the legalities associated with acquiring music (tapes and CDs), and what equipment is needed to play music to dance to.

# d) What is a "Caller"?

A caller could be a teacher, a singer, an entertainer, or a choreographer or all the above.

Discussions on the requirements of being a caller and the expectations dancers depend on the caller to know such as definitions and figures.

What callers need to be a successful caller and what they do not need.

Throughout this session, five potential callers took their turns at the mic calling to a square of dancers and all performed well.

Various websites and free downloads were described as backup to the topics discussed throughout the session. There were also handouts and lots of very useful and interesting suggestions.

An open mic session included many interesting questions and follow up responses from Jeff and Andrea.

There were 38 dancers in attendance representing 11 clubs.

The event concluded with SWOSDA President Austin Hayward thanking Jeff and Andrea for the contributions to SWOSDA in putting on this particular informative learning session.

An Executive meeting held April 23, 2023 set a schedule for theme night special dances to be held monthly and conveners were appointed for these special dances.






