If you have not registered yet, you still can, but your name will be added to a waiting list.



Beside my reading chair I have had Bugles from the 90s before we started dancing. One item which caught my eye was a notice for Square Dance Campers Special Events 1998 In April 1998 Bugle. "July31-Aug1,2,3 -NSDCA Ontario Camporee at Tillsonburg – Guests Welcome" In another issue I noticed a reference to "170 units set up for the camporee in Tillsonburg celebrating their tenth anniversary." Prior to our own square dancing, Nick's sister had invited us to come downtown to the Fairgrounds to see them dance.

Nick still was working at the time. We didn't start dancing until just before he retired. We did go to the dance site. The whole former ice surface in the Memorial Arena was covered with dancers. I've looked in the SWOSDA albums but didn't find any pictures concerning that event. I would appreciate your assistance if you were at this or any other Camporee event and could share pictures or information about the Camporee in Tillsonburg or other sites. Where else had it been held? In what different years was Camporee held? Today as I worked on this, I found 2 other references in other issues – You will hear more about this later.

I'm also working on creating a binder with pictures of the executive groups through the years. I am including a picture of each group along with the lists through the years. Unfortunately, some of the pictures do not have the individuals identified. When I bring that binder to a SWOSDA dance, please help me out by taking a peek to see if you can name the mystery folks. If you have been on executive years and have not received a picture of your group from me it may be because I do not have a picture of you so have not completed the collage for that group. Please send me your picture and indicate the years you were on the executive and I can rectify that problem and make sure you get a copy.

Another discovery I have made this afternoon is how difficult it is to complete an article when one of my daughter's cats wants attention and sprawls across the base of the keyboard. His internal motor revved up frequently as a reminder that I was falling down on the job and not petting him as required.

I am of the mindset that, dependent upon circumstance, all the above are significant and are paramount when associated with our square and round dancing activities.

We know enough to thank all those in our square at the completion of a tip, but did we think to acknowledge the caller or cuer for their expertise and the time it took them to prepare the dance program?

Did we think that those yummy cookies and treats just magically appeared on the goodie table? Have you thought to thank those that prepared and brought those treats for your enjoyment?

Are we so naïve to think that booking the hall, decorating, setting out tables and chairs, sweeping floors and cleaning up was all done by the dance fairy?

When dancers come through the door to attend your dance, are you thinking that you are not needed to welcome them and that someone else will do it?

Have you ever thought of how much work, time and knowledge go into the production of your monthly newsletter or publication and that perhaps that she or he would love to hear how much they are appreciated?

Your club, association, Federation and Society executive members have taken a step forward and have committed their leadership time and talents to make our activity what it is, and they too appreciate acknowledgement with an occasional, simple thank-you.

Are you aware that a recent survey has indicated that nearly 50% of those that contribute freely of their time and talents, would not do so if they felt they were not appreciated?

Words of gratitude or of showing appreciation in our everyday lives can be powerful. We can all benefit from being recognized for things we have done. Gratitude is also an essential element of ones well-being. A sense of gratitude is a sincere and positive experience that plays a large part in increased moral and a happier life.


