Remember When...

Looking Back – at 10-year intervals through October Bugles – by Dorothy Dahm

Dan's message that the Bugle deadline for all reports was getting close came at the perfect time. The week had not started well. (My microwave gave up the ghost, one of my hearing aids disappeared overnight, news arrived of a severe accident of a family friend and her son and a rainy day interfered with my fall plans for the garden and yard.) Dan had provided the perfect excuse for me to work on this Bugle report. It is great therapy. I enjoy reading those back issues and recalling the memories of the good times and good friends we made while dancing. My goal is to submit my report before October arrives. Locating the issues I needed ran fairly quickly because earlier in the summer I had tidied up those shelves and labelled them so they could be located more easily when needed.

2015 – Presidents Heather & Mark Ackersviller were congratulating Tri-County Squares (our home club) on our 10th Anniversary and how we had certainly made a mark for ourselves for SWOSDA and the community. They were coming to make a presentation to the club and a commemorative certificate recognizing our first milestone as a club.

Jubilee Rounds hosted Sept. SWOSDA Round Dance Party in St. Jacobs with sunshine and 48 smiling round dancers guided by host cuer Andrea Priest and volunteers Dan Roy, Stan McKeen and Maria Harrison. What a way to start the new season!

In my article, called at the time **Remember When**, I had chosen to list the national conventions, time, location. In his feature article, Dan Roy recalled meeting Mae Greenhough (2nd from the right in photo) at the 2006 Convention in Montreal. She and her husband Lloyd had been the chair couple at the first convention in Edmonton in 1978. Nick and I had also met this feisty lady, 87 still going strong in Montreal. Following the death of her husband, she was escorted by her son and his wife. At the 2008 convention she was one of the over 15 Society members who had attended all previous Canadian Conventions and were presented with Perfect Attendance



Certificates and Long Service Award Pins. Partway through the 2008 convention she was signing up for the 2010 convention. Dan reported he heard her son say, "Mom, you might not even be here anymore." She looked him straight in the eye and said, "If I don't plan for it, I sure won't. " Have you signed up for the next convention? I only wish I could!

2005 – Presidents Stan & Carol Down reported that the weather really co-operated with the summer dances and demos that were outside and the campers were still enjoying beautiful weather. Ted and Sarah Stover had received their Trillium Award at the Swing N Wheels Campout and Dance in Forest.

Tri-County Squares had at least 44 new dancers on their first beginner's night with at least 8 more committed to being there for the second session. Many of the clubs or dancers had been donating to the victims of Hurricane Katrina.

The September Round Dance Party was hosted in Clinton by Kincardine Sunset Rounds and included a Jive Clinic in the afternoon. Denny and Judy Howlett and Shiloh Buckles and Bows were preparing for the October SWOSDA Dance at Lambton Centennial in Petrolia; thirty-five years prior the club started in the Howlett basement, but they outgrew that space and moved to the new Lambton Centennial school. The club later changed to the advanced level, but continued their June Campout and the Christmas dinner at Plus level.

1995 -Presidents Edward and Lois Wise reported that the Callers Clinic sponsored a special weekend on Sept. 22-23 with guest caller, John Kaltenthaler , from Pocono Pines, Pennsylvania. Dances Friday night in Cambridge (10 squares) and Saturday night in St. Thomas (about 14 squares) provided the dancers with very nice fun level dancing. A clinic for the callers on Saturday afternoon provided many varied ideas to enhance their own style and techniques.

Dancers were encouraged to Come to Dance in Alberta, Convention '96, to be "Alberta Bound" for the 10th Canadian National, at "The place the National Started."

Unexpected visitors stole some of my scheduled writing time and space. I had told Dan I would have my article in before October arrived. It didn't happen.
